Eagle/Hornaday Award

Hello Everyone,

My name is Cameron Patterson and I am a 15 year old Boy Scout in Troop 433 Winslow, ME. I am working on my Eagle Project and also the Hornaday Award. My

Scoutmaster is Chris Bernier. Most people know what an Eagle Project is but very few know what the Hornaday Award is. Let me give you a brief description of the Award.

William T. Hornaday Awards are presented for distinguished service in natural resource conservation. These awards are unusual prizes with demanding expectations. They are given at the national level. To earn the Hornaday Badge, a scout must earn 5 merit badges based on Conservation issues (examples are Environmental Science, Fish and Wildlife Management Soil and Water Conservation, Bird Study, Forestry, Fishing, Gardening, Mammal Study, etc.). I have earned 11 and am working on my 12<sup>th</sup> at this time. A scout is also required to plan, lead, and carry out one conservation project. This is not like the Eagle project, with this award the project needs to show the need, and fall into one of 8 categories. My project is in the Fish and Wildlife Management. The project must consist of Research, a project proposal, Planning, Scheduling, Recruiting, Communication and Coverage, Documentation of everything that is done, and the Execution of the project. This is not where the Hornaday Project ends. A Hornaday Award Recipient needs to follow the progress of the project over time. After everything is done a write up of everything from start to finish needs to be done and presented.

The State of Maine has only given out 3 of these Awards in its history, the last being in 1944. When my Scoutmaster told me that is was unusual for a Scout to receive this award, I had to go for it.

Now let me give you some details about my project. I found the problem of people being uneducated about the Soft Plastic Lures that are in our water ways and that are harming our fishes. So with that I met with Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, and started working with one of their Biologists, Mr. Dana DeGraaf. With the help of many others, including Dick Gaudreau of Maine Bass Nation, we have come up with a project of constructing 10 Recycling Containers for Soft Plastic Lures, placing them at boat landings with a poster telling about the harms of Soft Plastic Lures. I am also leading a cleanup of Tricky Pond in Naples Maine and doing a yearlong research on Soft Plastic Lures (Biodegradable vs. Regular Soft Plastic Lures) one that has never been done before. I will be collecting and recording the Recycled Soft Plastic Lures for the 2015 open water fishing season, and after that I will be lining up some one or group to tend to the containers on a long term basis. After all this I will be writing up an article for the Fishing law book that goes out with fishing licenses. All in all this project will take close to 2 years to complete. I have been in the planning process now for close to 8 months now. There is still a lot to do.


